

Since launch cumulative performance graph





Risk Profile

Fund Objective

The Fund's investment objective is to generate a high level of income and capital appreciation over the medium to long term.

Investment Policy

The portfolio will apart from assets in liquid form, invest solely in the participatory interests of the Saffron BCI Global Enhanced Income Fund, established under the Prescient Global Funds ICAV domiciled in Ireland. The underlying portfolio invests primarily in debt and debt-related securities issued by governments and corporations listed on global recognised exchanges. To the extent that the assets in the portfolio are exposed to exchange rate risk, the manager may enter into financial transactions for the exclusive purpose of hedging such exchange rate risk subject to the conditions and limits as stipulated by the Act.

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Fund Manager Quarterly Comment - As at 31 December 2023

The Saffron Global Enhanced Income Fund delivered a strong performance in Q4, achieving a return of 2.49%, surpassing its benchmark, the Secured Overnight Financing Rate (SOFR) +3% return of 2.14%. The fund ended the quarter with a gross running yield of 5.98%, benefiting from an increased allocation to Additional Tier 1 (AT1) instruments and short-dated US Treasuries.

In the US bond market, Treasury yields varied significantly. The 2-Year yield decreased from a quarter open of 5.12% to 4.26% by quarter end, while the 10-Year yield rallied from an initial 4.70% to 3.88% in reaction to the release of Federal Reserve's policy stance on interest rates. The Fed held the funds rate steady at 5.25%-5.5%, with projections indicating a potential decrease to 4.6% by the end of 2024, suggesting a shift from the previous rate hiking position. Notably, the 10v2 yield curve inversion saw significant changes over the quarter, starting at -18 basis points and reaching -53 basis points in mid-December before ending the quarter at -35 basis points.

Inflation, as measured by Core Personal Consumption Expenditures (PCE), continued its downward trend, falling to 2.64% in November from 3.37% in September, supporting the Federal Reserve rhetoric and a more dovish stance on future monetary policies.

Emerging market stability improved Q4. Brazil's 5-year Credit Default Swap (CDS) decreased from 186 to 132, and South Africa's from 278 to 202, indicating reduced risk perceptions and heightened market confidence in these emerging economies.

The European Central Bank (ECB) maintained its high interest rates, keeping the main refinancing operations rate at 4.5% and the deposit facility rate at 4%. However, the inflation rate for December in the Euro area reversed several months of decline, increasing to 2.6% from 2.4% in November. The ECB's overall stance remained cautious, with potential rate cuts anticipated starting in Q2 2024. However, this timeline may be delayed if inflation rates continue to rise.

China's economy showed signs of recovery with improvements in the Caixin Manufacturing PMI to 50.8 and Services PMI to 52.9, though challenges persist. The real estate sector remains a significant risk, with the average price of new homes in 70 major cities falling for six consecutive months. Financial issues among real estate developers and local governments are intensifying, as highlighted by Moody's recent downgrade of China's sovereign credit outlook from stable to negative.

Geopolitical factors, including the upcoming Taiwanese presidential election and the U.S. election, may impact foreign investor interest in China. Despite a surge in industrial production in November, retail sales growth did not meet expectations, indicating a consumption slowdown. This trend, coupled with the real estate market slump, is expected to dampen economic growth and consumer sentiment in the coming year.

Overall, Q4 2023 was characterized by dynamic economic and monetary developments, with the markets adjusting to changing inflation rates and policy directions. The coming quarters will likely continue to be shaped by these evolving economic conditions, and a close watch on these indicators will be essential for informed investment decisions.

In response to the changing landscape in the US Treasury market, particularly the decline in yields influenced by the Federal Reserve's dovish position on interest rates and the anticipation of potential rate cuts in the early part of 2024, the fund is strategically adjusting its portfolio composition. This adjustment entails a reallocation of assets, moving away from short-term US Treasury bills and increasing exposure to Subordinated and Senior Unsecured debt. The fund is also aiming to enhance its investment in these debt categories by allocating additional capital. This strategic shift is designed to optimize returns in the context of the current and projected interest rate environment.

Looking ahead to 2024, the global financial market is expected to be influenced by several key factors, including the Federal Reserve's interest rate policy, inflation trends worldwide, and significant economic shifts in both emerging and established markets. The performance of emerging markets, particularly in the context of China's economic adjustments, will be important to monitor. Additionally, geopolitical developments, such as the U.S. elections, are likely to contribute to market fluctuations.

These factors will necessitate a dynamic approach to asset allocation, emphasizing both yield optimization and risk management. The fund will closely track these global economic indicators and policy changes, adapting its strategy to align with the evolving market landscape. In this potentially unpredictable environment, the ability to swiftly adjust to new information and trends will be crucial. The fund aims to leverage these changes, seeking opportunities that arise from the shifting global economic conditions.



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
